October always draws me to Ecclesiastes 3:1-15.

3 For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: ² a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; ³ a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; ⁴ a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; ⁵ a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; ⁶ a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; ⁷ a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep

silence, and a time to speak; ⁸ a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.

⁹ What gain have the workers from their toil? ¹⁰ I have seen the business that God has given to everyone to be busy with. ¹¹ He has made everything suitable for its time; moreover he has put a sense of past and future into their minds, yet they cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end. ¹² I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; ¹³ moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil. ¹⁴ I know that whatever God does endures forever; nothing can be added to it, nor anything taken from it; God has done this, so that all should stand in awe before him. ¹⁵ That which is, already has been; that which is to be, already is; and God seeks out what has gone by.

October always draws me to Ecclesiastes 3:1-15. There is this wonderful tension of embracing what is coming and yet appreciating and honoring what has been. Verses 1-8 move us through the ebb and flow of life. Do you read them and think of times you have been on both sides? Are you mindful of where you are now and what is next? The balance of these verses and God's companionship through them all can give us hope and peace.

Verses 9-15 continue to call us to be mindful of God's hand in our joys and lives. As autumn takes hold we see the changing ways of nature and of life and we are reminded there is a time for all under God's will and ways. All that we have comes as a gift from God.

Autumn and the harvest bring to mind the fullness of all we have and all we are blessed with. In the signs of harvest this month it makes me ask what are the bounties we have and how can we share them? Where are we sharing God's Good News? Can we share gently used clothes with Rescue Mission of Trenton's attempt to get the Guinness World Record of largest clothes collection running from October 15-Nov.? Can we add to the Deacon's food basket for Crisis Ministry? Can we share some time and a listening ear? Can we share some time creating with our Craft group? Can we share some strength working on some clean up with Scott's crew? Can we share the peace of Christ out into the world we go?

Let us at every turn, turn, turn extend God's grace as we go through this new season.

Notes from the Organ Bench

This year our choir will present a variety of anthems, styles and sources, as we have before.

Each month, we will highlight a contemporary American composer who has provided us with a particular anthem.

For our anthem for World Communion Sunday, October 4, the choir will offer the traditional American spiritual "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands." This well-known title first appeared in a paper-bound hymnal in 1927. Our arrangement is by Earlene Rentz.

Born in Moultrie, Georgia in 1956, Earlene Rentz received a bachelor's degree in Music Education from the University of Montevallo in Alabama. She later earned masters and doctoral degrees from Florida State University. For many years, she taught music to high school, junior high and elementary school students in her native Georgia. She has also been called upon to conduct all-state choirs in Georgia, Kentucky, Alabama and Florida. In addition to having more than 300 sacred and secular compositions to her credit, Ms. Rentz has been recognized as a specialist in developing rehearsal techniques to assist choral musicians in learning choral music. She currently works as a freelance choral writer and speaker and clinician in choral music education.

The 221st General Assembly (2014) approved transforming the **Peacemaking Offering** to the **Peace & Global Witness Offering** to build on the rich tradition of our church's commitment to peacemaking as well as to engage with our global partners in new initiatives of reconciliation. When we receive this offering which will be dedicated on World Communion Sunday on October 4th, we will be helping to address some of the most urgent threats to peace. We will retain 25% for our own peacemaking efforts so please, place your donation in the yellow Mission Giving envelope found in your pew.

In keeping with our commitment to Mission by this congregation, we are also beginning a yearlong project to focus our attention on our Mission Partners and keep them faithfully in our prayers. We all know that we were forced to significantly reduce out financial support for all of them but one thing we do not have to reduce is our commitment to pray for them and their work. So, you will find a card in your bulletin on October 4 which will be about one of our missionaries. We ask that you place this card in a prominent place in your home and use it as a reminder to pray often and with faith for the work of that person and program. If you are inclined, maybe you would also consider setting aside a bit of money once in a while so you can give something extra for their support.
